FUNDRAISING

WELFARE

Our welfare support has included providing funding towards aids to make the twilight years of the veterans as safe and comfortable as possible, including panic alarms, stair lifts, and wheelchairs. A large part of our welfare work, more recently, has been to organise and undertake annual pilgrimage trips to Normandy for veterans from all services who took part in D Day and the battle for Normandy.

We escort veterans to commemorative events across Normandy every June, focussing on the key areas of remembrance for them. We work in partnership with the local Mayors and lead organisations to deliver ceremonies in key locations and also ensure that time is made for veterans to visit locations that are particularly significant for them.

Throughout the year we take veterans to events and visits to provide ongoing interest and encouragement to them. Whether it is a Normandy Pilgrimage or an event or outing in the UK, we always ensure that we provide the right level of resources for their comfort, care and safety.

One of the high points of the year is for the veterans to attend the annual Remembrance Parade at the Cenotaph in November.

Our ethos is clear. We strongly believe that the veterans have already paid the price, so we ensure that they are not charged for anything when they attend events or pilgrimages with us through the year.



EDUCATION

Our education focus is:

- To imbed the history of WWII in the minds of future generations, emphasising the critical importance of the Normandy Campaign within that context.
- To instil remembrance, ensuring that the sacrifices of those who fought are understood and not forgotten.
- To emphasize the fragility of peace, the futility of aggression, the horrors of conflict, and the need for dialogue amongst all nations to prevent escalation.

Working in close liaison with the Young Historian Project, the Trust awards prizes annually for projects submitted by schools and individuals. Trustees also welcome the opportunity to visit schools and address students about relevant topics and attitudes. The Trust is gathering archive material on veterans to assist in the perpetuation of their stories both in presentations and, hopefully, as part of future permanent exhibitions in relevant museums.

THE SPIRIT OF NORMANDY TRUST YOUNG HISTORIAN PRIZES

Entries of projects will be judged annually by the Young Historian Project, a committee of educators chaired by Dr Trevor James in conjunction with Dr Jane Ainsworth, Director of the Young Historian Awards Scheme. The committee members, like SONT Trustees, are volunteers and judge submissions in various categories before making recommendations to the Trust. Details of entry can be found in the education section of the SONT website.

Entries are accepted under three age group categories: Primary, Key Stage 3 and Senior.
At the Primary level we would expect most*
entries to come from collaborative class projects, whereas entries in the older category groups would usually be from individuals.

A winning entry is selected for each age group, and individuals as well as their schools receive a cash prize. Additional prizes can also be awarded for Highly Recommended work, at the discretion of the judges. The General Peter Martin Award, named in honour of the founding Chairman of the Trust, can be awarded if an entry is considered exceptional.

All entrants will receive recognition of participation, and Trustees would be willing to present prizes to winning schools if invited, and where appropriate.
